


Glossary of Authorship for Academic Publication

Role	Description	Examples
Main Author/ First Author	The person listed first in the authorship list, often responsible for the majority of the research and writing.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNIMAS Author or • External author or • Students
Co-Author	Contributes significantly to the creation of a scholarly work, such as a research paper, article, book, or presentation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNIMAS Author or • External author or • Students

Corresponding Author 1	The person primarily responsible for managing communication about a research paper or article with the journal, reviewers, and the wider academic community.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The corresponding author's name is usually marked with an asterisk (*) or explicitly labeled in the author list of the paper. Their contact information (email address) is also provided for accessibility.
Corresponding Author 2, 3, 4 & 5	The term "Corresponding Author 2, 3, 4 etc." typically arises when multiple corresponding authors are designated for a paper. This is more common in interdisciplinary works or large collaborative projects.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● UNIMAS Author or ● External author or ● Students

Publication Type

Type	Description	Examples
Article	A formal piece of writing that typically presents research findings, theoretical discussions, or a review of existing knowledge on a specific topic.	Includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• pdf copy of the article (complete with title/vol./issue/pages/ISSN/journal title/year of publication etc.)
Proceedings	A collection of academic papers or reports presented at a conference, symposium, workshop, or other professional gatherings.	A formal record of the event and may include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Full Papers or Abstracts• Summaries• Editorial Notes• Date of event• Location of event
